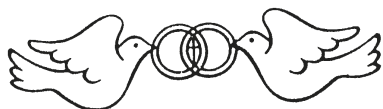

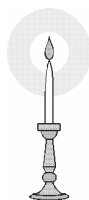
Gospel Light's SonSurf Beach Bash VBS

¿Qué Te Hace Feliz?

¡Bienvenidos a todos los trabajadores agrícolas y los migrantes! ¡Gracias por el trabajo que hacen!

Recientemente yo leí un libro escrito por un hombre que ha tenido esclerosis múltiple por más de 30 años, empezando a la edad de 25. Esta enfermedad le ha afectado en todo su cuerpo, primero en la vista, seguido por un equilibrio malo, y un uso difícil de las manos. En el medio de todo eso él cuenta que se siente feliz, que su esposa e hijos lo entienden y lo aman; como familia hacen cosas. Es verdad que él piensa que podría sentirse más feliz sin la enfermedad, pero a pesar de su enfermedad, él ha encontrado la risa en sí mismo y en las risas y alegría de los otros de su familia. El había decidido vivir positivamente, y eso se le ha hecho la diferencia.

Hoy día en las universidades se exploran la felicidad, su por qué y por consiguiente. Aun hay talleres que dicen que pueden ayudar a alguien lograr la felicidad en tres meses. En los Estados Unidos hay un mayor porcentaje de personas que sufren de depresión. Bueno, no se puede tener un alto nivel de alegría y felicidad todo el tiempo. No podemos sostener tales emociones, pero sí, con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo podemos ser más positivos en nuestras actitudes y reacciones hacia la vida.

¿Qué es la vida feliz? Se dice que la vida feliz es la vida moralmente buena, juzgada por una dimensión trascendente—por un estándar objetivo de valor. Algunas de las virtudes morales más importantes son sabiduría, valentía, amor, justicia, templanza, y espiritualidad. Hay que optar vivir voluntariamente hábitos nuevos si no se siente feliz. Gente feliz tiene un alto nivel de autoestima, espiritualidad y fe religiosa; son comprometidos a significados trascendentes en sus vidas. No es el dinero que les hace felices. Muchos son más felices cuando se olvidan de sí mismos, mientras sirven a los demás por el amor. Cuando haya más confianza, inclusión, amor, cooperación, empatía, colaboración, perdón e igualdad democrática se ve y se siente más felicidad. Algunas prácticas para adquirir la felicidad son amar, expresar el agradecimiento, la esperanza, bondad, perdón, tolerancia, compromiso, perseverancia y obras buenas. The Co-op is a method of pre-planning your food budget, you will pay at the beginning of the month and at the end of the month, when sometimes funds are limited, you will receive your groceries.

The Co-op can always use volunteers. The Co-op will be held at the Parish Center on the last Friday of the month, it will be an opportunity to sign up for the next month or to volunteer to work at the Co-Op. It is in operation from 8:30 to 10:00 AM. The truck arrives before 8:00 a.m. and it takes about half hour to set up.

Consult a priest at least a year in advance.
