From Father Paul

This weekend we celebrate Independence Day, the Fourth of July. Parades, picnics and fireworks are a part of our nation's style for observing this holiday and all are good ingredients for the party part of it. But perhaps because of September 11th or because there are so many wars, uprisings and protests around the globe, we also can be aware of the unique significance this day bears. Many of the thoughts below I found in an article by Rev. Anthony Kadavil written about this special holiday. He wrote the best parts.

Our Fourth of July is a day to thank God for the political and religious freedom we enjoy and to pray for God's special blessings on the government leaders and people of our country. It is a day to remember with gratitude the founding fathers of our nation, especially Thomas Jefferson, the author of the *Declaration of Independence*, and James Madison, the architect of the *Constitution*, who believed that all power, including political power, came from God and was given to the people. It is the people who entrust power to government leaders to be used for the common good.

This is a day to remember, pray for and admire all military personnel who have given their lives for our country. We also pray for those fighting our too many wars today, for their families and for all the wounded. We pray for peace, - especially as our name is *Our Lady of Peace Parish*, it is a cause dear to our hearts and the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

This is a day to remember the basic principle underlined in the *Constitution* that "all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." Because our nation did not honor

This is a day to celebrate our ideals and aim for them personally, to celebrate our diversity and do what we can to foster respectful community, to celebrate our own lives and our loved ones and resolve to promote in all things respect for everyone's life.

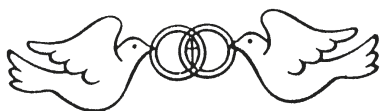

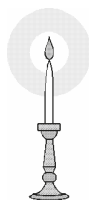

Cuando vas caminando por la naturaleza, o cuando está sentado en el medio de la naturaleza, vaya pensando en Dios, en la belleza de todo lo que Dios ha creado y en el amor con que hizo todo, y alábele y déle gracias por la grandeza de lo creado. O puede ser que desea cantarle unas alabanzas por la creación. Adelante—use su imaginación para conectarse con Dios. A la vez en su vivencia diaria cuide la tierra; dependemos de ella. *Hermana Kay*
